- (c) Discuss the role of data mining as a key function of business intelligence and expected types of information obtainable from data mining which enable above supermarket chain to optimize decision making. Provide suitable examples for above discussed information types. (06 Marks)
- (d) Identify and critically discuss most important technologies for safeguarding information resources of above supermarket chain. (08 Marks)
